

Longtime Northeast resident celebrates new citizenship

The Northeast News extends our congratulations to one of Historic Northeast's newest American citizens, Rol Deng. The Business Development Representative for the Northeast Chamber of Commerce was sworn in as a United States citizen last Wednesday, Dec. 8.

Deng immigrated to the United States 21 years ago from Egypt, but is originally from Aweil, Sudan. He settled here in Historic Northeast with his family, where he worked tirelessly to send his children to college.

Now, he is working on his Bachelor of Applied Science in Business Management at Northwest Missouri State University and works full-time for the Northeast Chamber and the Independence Avenue Community Improvement District. On taking the oath to become a U.S. citizen, he says he's very normal.

"I am very proud, I have a lot of opportunities as a United States citizen and in the community, as well," Deng said. "So it is really a great achievement for me to be a citizen today."

The first thing Deng will do with his new citizenship is return to his home country to visit his mother, who is 88. He plans to surprise her by sitting down and holding her hand, something he hasn't done in over two decades.










ADA Ramp Replacement Before & After





Project Expectations & Timeline

- The SCOPE of WORK RFP will be published in February. The Independence Avenue project is one of three upon which a contractor is being sought. The SOW will include standard concrete work, stamped/colored concrete work and brick work. The RFP includes all three projects, not to exceed \$700,000. The funds for these projects are funded by the city's ADA compliance fund.
- The project budget for the Independence Avenue phase will cap out at \$250,000. This is supposed to be a hard cap. It is possible that some of the Independence Avenue project may not be completed if the project cannot be completed within the \$250,000 budget. Priority is being given to the ADA ramps along the Blvd, from Highland to Benton.
- Public Works is not planning on charging an administrative fee against the pledged funds. Allegedly, the fees will be paid for by other funding sources. That being said, this is not a guarantee, and we should seek PIAC funding to ensure project completion. It is not likely that any of the ADA funds for the project will be available after the ramp component is completed.
- The targeted project work area is the Boulevard, from Highland to Benton. Within this target area are 49 ramps. To break down an estimated cost, a standard concrete ramp will cost \$4,000 to \$4,500. Stamped, colored concrete ramps are \$6,500 to \$8,000 and brick/concrete ramps are \$10,000 to \$12,500.
- If all the ramps were basic concrete, the project cost is \$196,000 \$220,000. If all were stamped concrete, the project cost is \$294,000 \$392,000. For the brick/concrete ramps, expect \$490,000 to \$612,500. Uday and I are still in the process of inspecting all of the ramp and related environs.
- At this stage, curbs and sidewalk replacement has not been calculated. Concrete sidewalks cost \$14 per linear foot to pour. There are a lot
 of sidewalk squares that need to be replaced due to their potential as trip hazards. Almost all of the sidewalk in front of Independence Plaza
 Park, both north and south sides, virtually all of the sidewalk in front of SVN and most of the sidewalk in front of Century Towers.

Project Expectations & Timeline

- Based upon the projected scenario costs listed above, there will just not be any money to do it all unless we can access PIAC funds or GO
 Bond funds. However, the likelihood is that some of the 49 ramps/environs can do without replacement, and brickwork should be minimal at
 many of the intersections.
- The sidewalk bricks and mortar are overall in solid condition, There is very little missing mortar, most of the mortar is still tightly adhered to the bricks, and the brick condition is very good. Three items would need to be addressed here- the street name plate, sewer cover, and the ramp itself. The contractor will cut these items out and replace them.
- Once the contractor has been secured, there will be additional meetings as well as on-site inspections that will provide specific detail as to
 what should be done at each corner. No work will begin until we (CID) sign off on the work. The project should begin in May and be
 completed by October, all things controllable being controlled and all uncontrollable things not happening.
- Public Works (city) has entered into maintenance contracts with Plaza Merchants, Downtown CID and a others and have asked if we (CID) would be interested in signing a contract. They are aware that the CIDs generate funds that could be applied to these type of projects. The organizations that execute these agreements would be allocated funds (to be negotiated prior to contract execution) for repair.
- All City contractors would be expected to abide by rules and regulations, such as Section 3 compliance, prevailing wages, etc.
