NON-MUNICIPAL FUNDING AND SERVICES CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN

THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI INDEPENDENCE AVENUE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into this first (1st) day of May 2018 by and between KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, a constitutionally chartered municipal corporation of the State of Missouri, through its CITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, hereinafter referred to as "CITY", and the INDEPENDENCE AVENUE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR", consists of two parts: PART I, SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND PART II, STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

WITNESSETH: Consisting of seventeen (17) alleys abutting Independence Avenue to the north and south, and certain park land known as Independence Plaza Park at approximately Brooklyn and Independence Avenue/Boulevard, and other public rights-of-way as may be designated by mutual agreement of the parties.

WHEREAS, City is the owner of certain real property, hereinafter referred to as "Property" within the area encompassed by the Independence Avenue Community Improvement District, and

WHEREAS, City desires to engage Contractor and Contractor agrees to provide services related to maintenance and safety of the Property, upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.

WHEREAS, City will provide twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for this undertaking:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter expressed, the parties mutually agree as follows:






Urban Street Ambassadors REPORT BY ZONES




