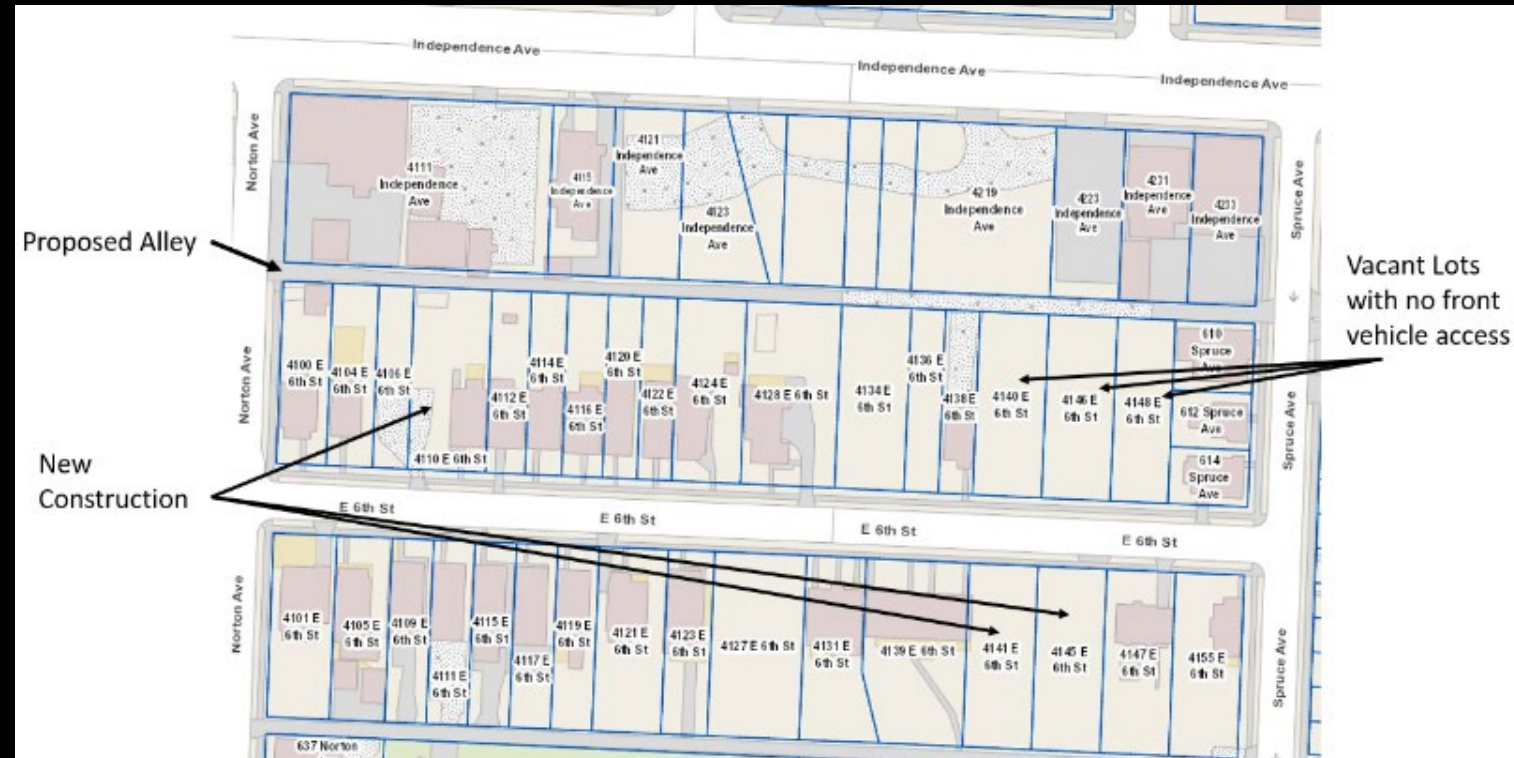


Alley Vacation

- July 29th meeting: City Planning about Alley Vacation

Alley Enhancement Plan

- Research provided proven methods of alley improvements
 - Clean – Green – Activate ex) Cameras, Signage, Lighting, Native Plants, Sense of Place (Murals, Name)
- Indiana – Bales
 - Drafted - MARC Solid Waste Management District Grant for Enhancement Opportunities
- Norton - Spruce

Enhancement Approaches - Clean, Green, Activate

The following approaches are intended to be in concert with alley vacation, pending permission and consent from residents and stakeholders, and can be completed with or without full alley vacation. The enhancements involve proven methods of alley remediations and are divided into a 3-step process; Clean, Green, Activate. Clean involves an alley cleanup and installation of signage, cameras, and lighting to aid in prevention efforts of illegal dumping. Green intends to beautify the landscape throughout the alley with native plants and rain gardens. Activate aims to provide the alley with a long-lasting sense of place through the naming and addition of street signs to the alley as well as a ribbon cutting event. Future events and clean-ups should be planned on a regular basis with residents, local business, and community partners.

Indiana - Bales

1. Clean

- In-progress with help from Artist Brian Mefes during June/July 2022. Repurposed clothing, recycled and removed litter, and on-site composting of unwanted plants.

- Strategically install anti-dumping multilingual signage on existing light poles. (Figure 1). Figure 2 displays the locations of new signage.

- d. Install dark-sky approved lighting (Figure #) adjacent to new signs and camera locations. Cameras would be installed and powered on existing light poles. Figure #6 displays locations of new lighting.

2. Green

- a. Introduce native low-maintenance perennial plants. Plants requiring sun such as hydrangeas, willowleaf sunflower, milkweed, bluestem, and coneflowers should be planted on the Northside of the alley. Sun/Shade or shade loving plants such as ferns, wild ginger, squaw weed, woodland spiderwort should be planted on the Southside of the alley. Figure 7 displays planting locations of either sun or shade/partial shades native plants.

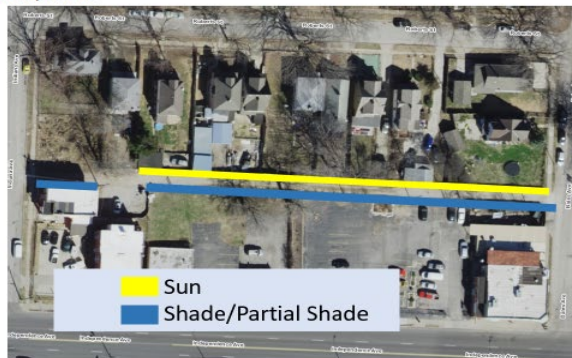

- b. A rain garden could potentially be in the location displayed in figure 8. This location would capture most of the alley runoff and could be combined with moisture/shade friendly native plantings.

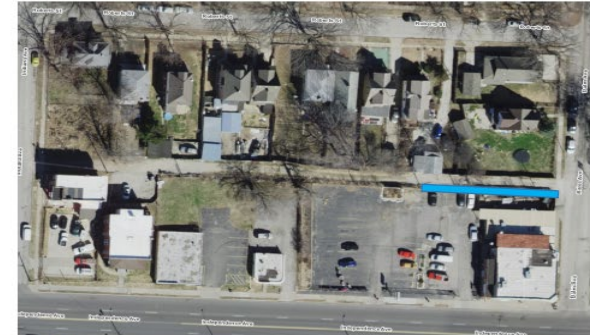

3. Activate

- a. Create a sense of place by naming the alley. The name could be decided by the community and local stakeholders. Figure 9 displays a potential name for the alley with historical reference to original platting name as well as CID Logo.

NON-MUNICIPAL FUNDING AND SERVICES CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN

THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI
AND
INDEPENDENCE AVENUE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into this first day of June, 2018 by and between KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, a constitutionally established corporation of the State of Missouri, through its CITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, hereinafter referred to as "CITY", and the INDEPENDENCE AVENUE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR", of two parts: PART I. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND PART II. STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

WITH the understanding that the CONTRACTOR is providing services to the CITY consisting of seventeen (17) alleys abutting Independence Avenue to the north and south of the park land known as Independence Plaza Park at approximately Brooklyn and Independence Avenue/Boulevard, and other public rights-of-way as may be designated by mutual agreement of the parties.

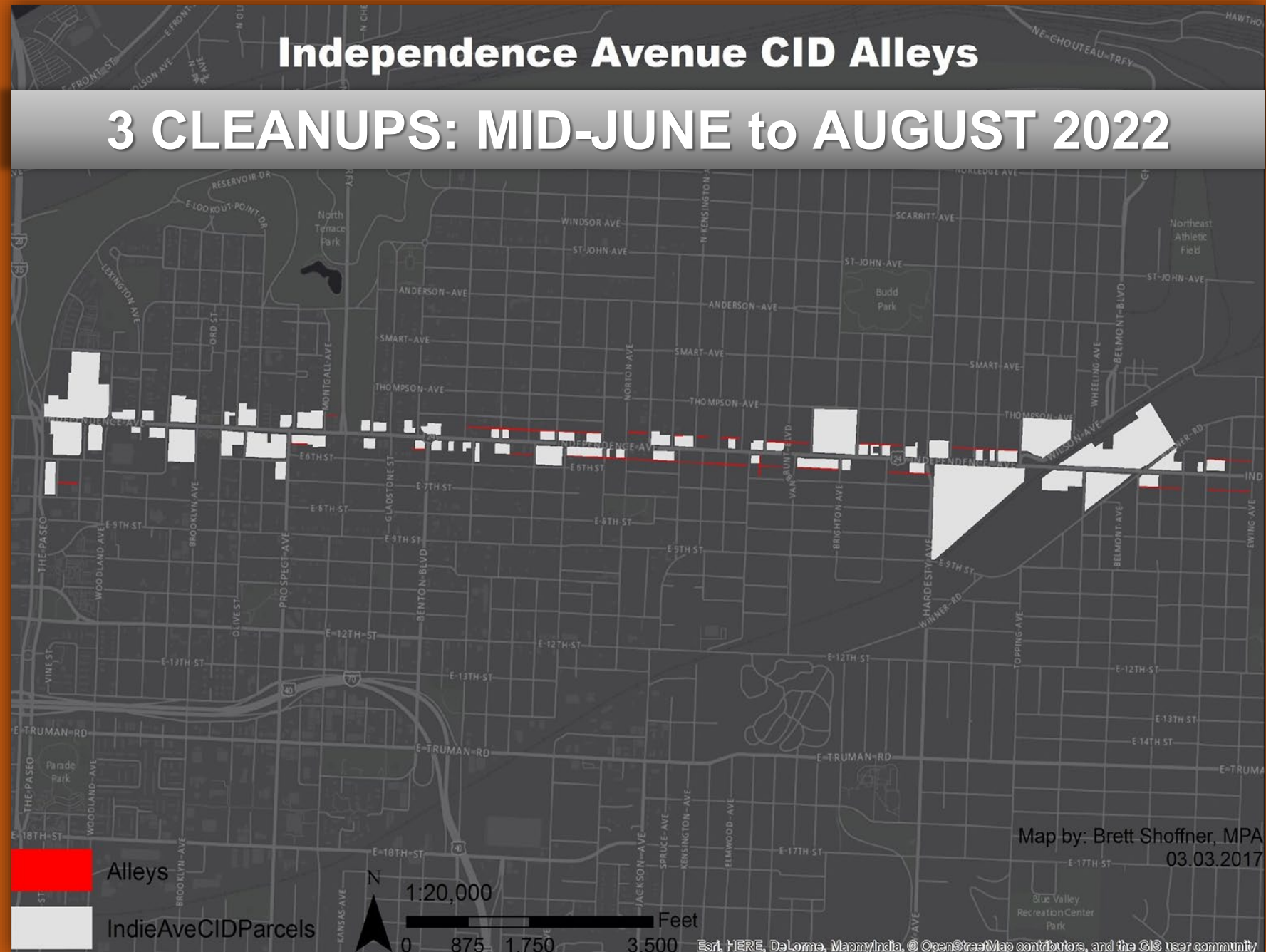
