AMERICAN SONS OF COLUMBUS



- The American Sons of Columbus building at 2415 Independence Boulevard has, since its dedication in 1966, been a central gathering point for Kansas Citians of Italian and Sicilian heritage.
- The original structure was built between 1909 and 1912 according to city records. From 1939 through 1945, Safeway Stores occupied the building, just to the east of the Independence Avenue Methodist Church.
- In 1945 Safeway moved to 3407 Independence Ave. and the space was taken over by the Genova Appliance & Furniture Store.



- By 1952 the location was listed as Brodkins Furniture Store through 1958 when the Fox Self Service Department Store leased the space.
- In 1963, Electronics Institute moved into the space, offering classes in the newly developing field of electronics to graduating high school seniors.
- Finally, in 1966, Tom Gialde and three friends purchased the building and dedicated a new home for The American Sons of Columbus.



- In September of 1970, the Independence Avenue Methodist-Episcopal Church celebrated its last service in the old sanctuary. Following the building's demolition, the Sons of Columbus annexed their parking lot to increase their club's capacity to host events.
- In addition to hosting annual events such as spaghetti dinners or pancake breakfasts, the Sons of Columbus Hall has been used as a gathering place for weddings, graduations, family reunions, candidate forums, the NEKC Chamber's semiannual International Taste & Tour, as well as a regular voltina location.

- Recreation figures heavily in the club's agenda and in 1978, an addition was added to the back of the building to accommodate new bocce courts.
- The American Sons of
 Columbus is one of only two bocce organizations recognized
 by the United States Bocce Federation in the state of Missouri.
- The Bocce courts were built with artificial turf, but a maintenance-free resin surface that provides a fast but consistent roll was installed in 2011.



 The resin surface was restored in 2023 in order to maintain the highest quality, professional playing surface available.




ACTIVITY: YEAR-TO-YEAR TIMELINE

- One thing is inevitable on Independence Avenue and that is change. The late 1940's and early 1950's brought a world of change to the eastern environs of the Avenue, specifically between the infamous 12-foot railroad bridge and the Winner Road stoplight just to the east.
- Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps from 1940-41 show the triangular parcel of land bordered by the Avenue to the north, Winner Road to the south and yet-to-bepaved White Avenue to the west, still undeveloped with the exception of a Standard Oil filling station at 6011 Independence Avenue.



- Northeast native Ross Cascio saw the growth potential in commercial real estate even back then, opening Cascio's Thriftway at 6201 Independence Ave. in the building now occupied by Westlake Hardware.
- Seeing the success of the suburban strip shopping center. Cascio built another commercial retail outlet just to the west, bearing the address 6003-6007 Independence Ave.
- The newly built retail spaces were occupied by a Western Auto store and the Allied Shoe Store
- Following the closure of Western Auto, the larger space was leased by TG&Y. Allied Shoes closed in the early 1970's. Shortly after, Godfather's Pizza leased the space.



- In the mid 1990's, TG&Y was closing stores nationwide and the remaining Avenue location was
- In June of 1998, following the closure of TG&Y a few years earlier, Family Dollar Stores began renovating the western part of the facility while Godfather's Pizza continued to do brisk business.
- In roughly 2001, Godfather's closed their doors and the space was leased to a retail fashion boutique, later a plasma clinic then a Gen-X Fashion boutique up



- Independence Ave, Gen-X consolidated their inventory from the 6007 space to 6199 Independence, just across
- The center is still a vital retail location on the eastern portion of Independence Avenue.
- Looking to the future, in late 2020 the 6007 space was leased to La Michoacana Paleteria, a branch of the El Torito complex of shops across the street. The space is in its final stages of renovation to a helado and paleteria shop, selling tasty ice cream treats as well as savory






